Offecct AB is a Swedish entrepreneur-led company with its headquarters and production in Tibro, Sweden. Offecct was founded in 1990 by Kurt Tingdal and Anders Englund. Offecct has 75 employees, a 20,000 m2 production facility and a yearly revenue of SEK 150 million. 50% of Offecct's sales comprise exports to more than 50 countries, and showrooms are situated in Stockholm, Gothenburg, Malmoe and Tibro (SE), Oslo (NO), Copenhagen (DK), Milan (IT), London (UK), Rotterdam and Amsterdam (NL), Düsseldorf and Munich (DE), Zürich (CH), New York (US) and Singapore (SG). Since May 2017 Offecct has been a part of Flokk, an international group of companies with a focus on developing furniture for working places. In addition to Offecct the group owns HÅG, RBM, RH, BMA, Giroflex, Malmstolen, Profim and 9to5 Seating.

Offecct's iconic Carry On product is now available as standard with a leather handle. The portable stool can be used by itself or as a complement to other furnishings. It is designed by Sweden based Mattias Stenberg based on the need for flexible workplaces and interaction in public spaces. Carry On tells the user how it can be used thanks to its oversized handle, but it also signals a desire for creativity in how we think and work. It has simple, round forms and a tailored impression that marries traditional materials and craftsmanship with modern design and function.

Mattias Stenberg

Mattias Stenberg, born 1975, is a Swedish designer with a degree from the Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm. In 2010 he founded his studio Vision A&D that focuses on contemporary architecture and design. Stenberg's design philosophy stands on three pillars: clarity in concept, form and material. Stenberg's architectural work affects the way he works with furniture and lighting, and he himself describes his furniture as "mini architecture."

Italian based Daniel Debiasi & Federico Sandri's collaboration with Offecct in 2018 resulted in a highly flexible easy chair named Shift. The easy chair – one seat and three different backs – can easily change the expression in a room. The different heights can be used for everything from individual focus on a work task, to pleasant relaxation and creative meetings. As the function can be varied and upgraded, Shift has a long life. This year Shift is upgraded with a base of solid white stained ash, so its expression can be further varied.

Daniel Debiasi and Federico Sandri founded their own design studio in 2010. Based in Italy, in Bolzano and Verona they work within various fields of design, ranging from objects to spaces. Their collaboration evolves along a continuous dialogue encouraged by spatial, cultural and behavioural observations. Multiple experiments with different materials and processes and the relationship between manufacture and craftsmanship form the basis for a much broader thinking, where objects are always considered as part of a bigger picture.
